

Operation of ‘Elevation of Safety Consensus’ Training Course for Students at University of Ulsan

- The OSHTI operates the ‘Elevation of Safety Consensus’ Open Campus Training Course in conjunction with the University of Ulsan starting on the 14th.
- Commemorating the second year of existence, the ‘Elevation of Safety Consensus’ Training Course is an educational program jointly implemented by local universities and public institutions relocated at rural areas in order to contribute to balanced national advancements by developing future talents destined to help developing local communities.
- Through this training, KOSHA aims to elevate the safety awareness of students by providing safety and health education focusing on job duties and actual on-site practices for college students who are future industrial workforces.
 - The training course is mostly comprised of occupational safety, construction safety and occupational health focusing on job trainings based on the National Competency Standard (NCS).
 - The program consists of the flipped learning using internet lectures and empirical training utilizing practical rooms in order to further strengthen educational effectiveness.
